

following that is to say first I give & devise and bequeath unto my beloved & brother Benjamin Storrs all those my two several Tenements lying in Bucken apoford with all and every of their appurtenances therunto belonging to hold to him the said Benjamin Storrs to his heirs and assigns forever and to and for his own sole use and benefit soundly I also give devise and bequeath unto my aforesaid beloved brother Benjamin Storrs all my ready money and securities for money together with all my household goods and household stuff and all and every other of my goods and chattels of what kind or nature soever or whatsoever that I may be possessed of to his sole use and benefit and well knowing the uncertainty of this life and being of a sound understanding & of a sober & temperate opinion and apparent my said beloved brother Benjamin Storrs full and sole executor to this my ^{last} will and testament hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made and this only to be deemed and taken as and for my last will and testament in writing which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day of October one thousand seven hundred and twenty four John Norris Esq. signed & sealed published and sealed by the said Ben Storrs as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us who have hereunto set our names as witnesses in his presence at his request in the presence of each other the words "his" in the 7th line and "apparent" in 14th line and "in" in 10th line being first intailed Robert Bulpett - grandson to the said Robert Bulpett the clerk of Robert Bulpett & John Marshall.

This Will was proved at London on the twentieth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight

hundred and before the Worshipful a Charles Coote Doctor of Laws and surrogate of the Right Honorable Sir William Wynne Knight Doctor of Laws and Master Keeper or Commissary of the prerogative court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Order of Benjamin Dorrice the Brother of the deceased and the sole Executor named in the said Will to whom a power was granted of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the deceased he having been first sworn duly to administer -
