 concerning my said daughter Ann Webb equally among
 them share alike and lastly & soe twards appoint my
 executors Thomas Strandfield of the parice of Hardley aforesaid
 farmer & deceased wife of the same Parice sent executors of his
 my last will & testament duly revoking all former wills by
 me made and soe twards that my said executors shall not
 be accountable for any loss that may happen to my estate or to
 the monies hereinbefore mentioned unless this or more
 justly neglect or default nor the one for the other of them nor
 for the act unrighteouness disbursement or default of the other
 of them but each of them for his own act wrong payments
 disbursement or default only and that they & each of them
 shall eschew from time to time out of my grosses personal
 estate pay reasonable & ratify all reasonable expenses within their
 or either of them may require or be put into in the execution of
 this my will in witness whereof & the testator John Evertt gave
 countersign my hand and seal the eighteenth day of July in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven, John

 presence of each other have subscribed our names as testators the
